

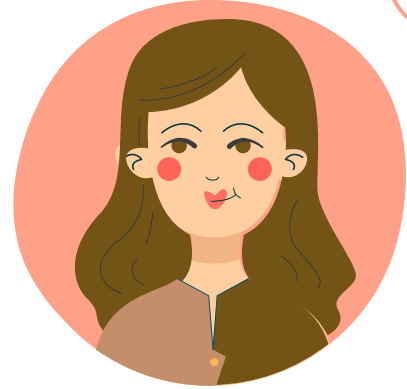


Collage Me Up!

Materials List

1. Large photo of your face that you can cut and draw on.
2. 2 white letter size paper
3. 1 or more construction colored paper
4. Scissors
5. Liquid glue like Elmer's Glue and a glue stick
6. Colored crayons or markers
7. Images that symbolize something meaningful to you. The images can be cut out from magazines or printed out from the internet. Drawn/ painted by you.
8. Found objects such as yarn, beads, origami paper, pipe cleaners, pom-poms, dried flowers

scissors



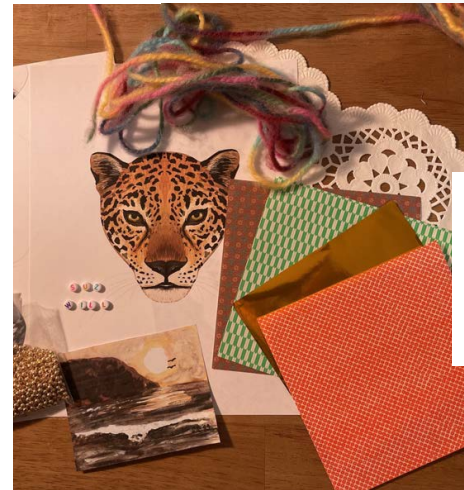

Draw a line down the center of the face. It can be a wavy line or a straight line.

Cut along the line.



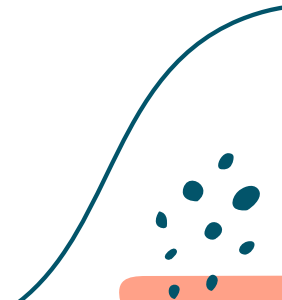
Step 3

Gather your materials and plan your self-portrait.



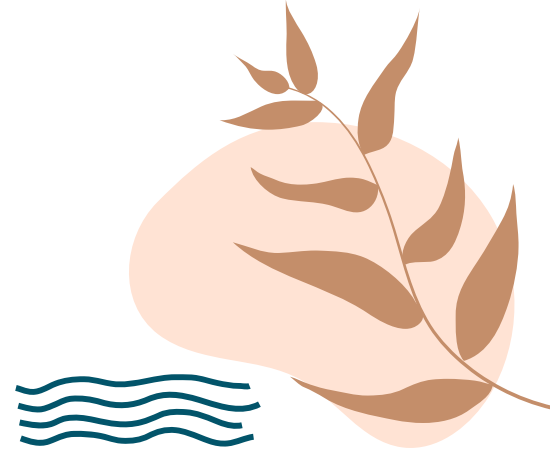
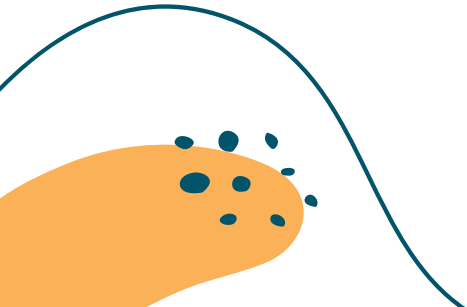
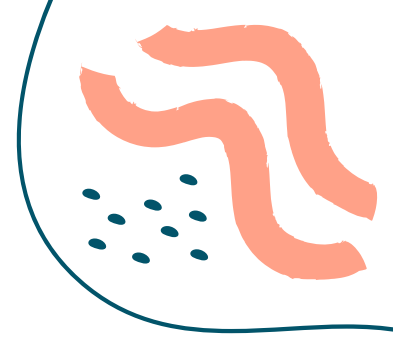

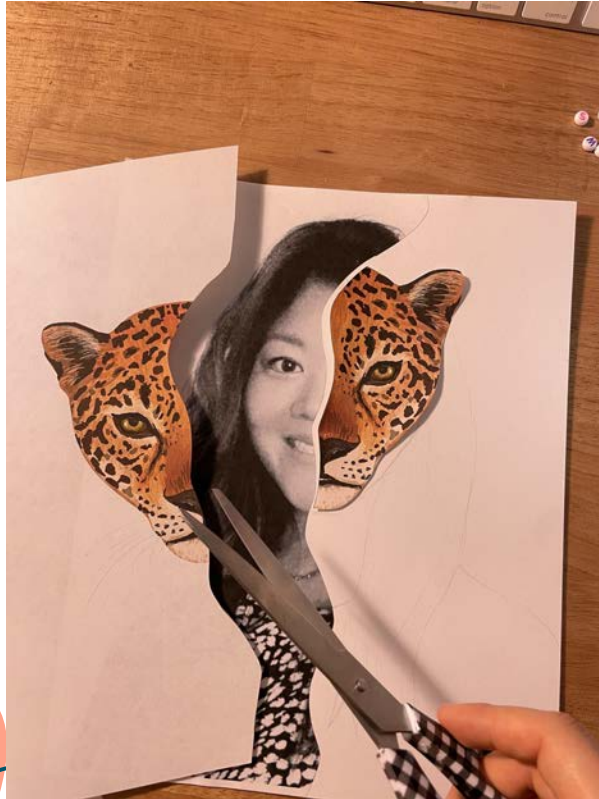
Step 4

Glue your half photograph to a piece of white paper.



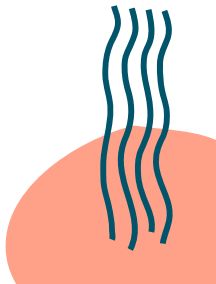
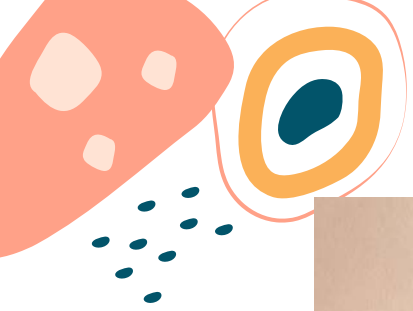
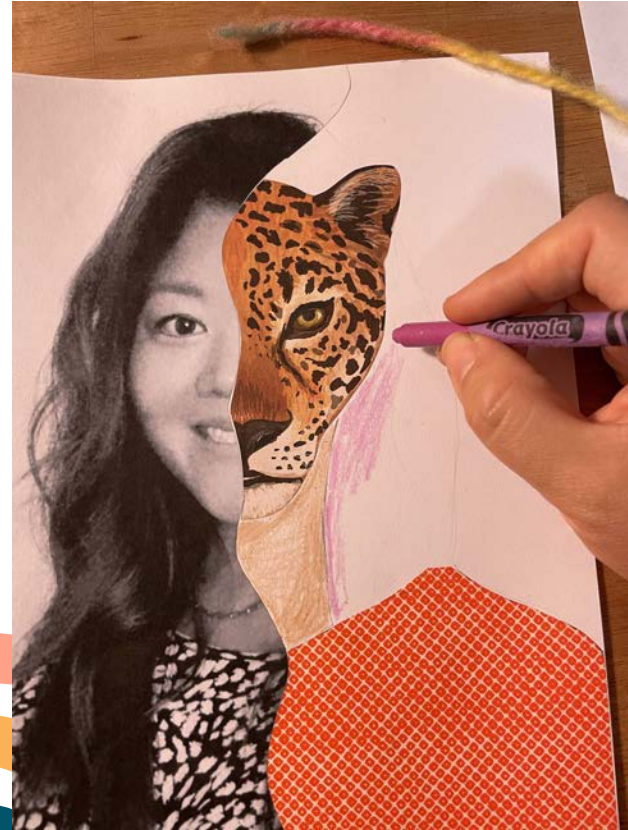
Step 5

Step 6

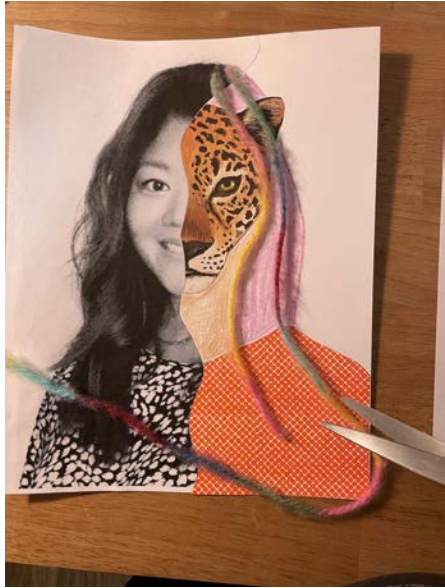
Add drawings and color

Add non-flat and textured objects such as yarn and beads with glue.



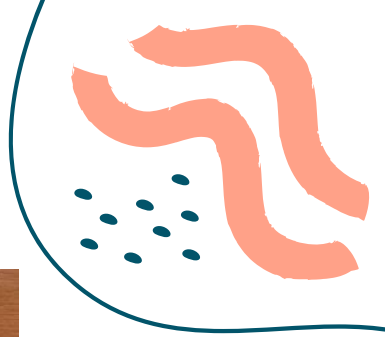
Step 8
